




GEORGES SEURAT




- Seurat was born in Paris,
 France in 1859.
- He was a painter.
- He spent his life studying color.
- He invented a painting technique known as Pointillism.







Pointillism is a painting technique in which the artist uses lots of small dots of color very close together.



The artist does not mix the colors. Instead our eyes optically mix or blend the colors.



Close up you can see the dots, but they're difficult to see from far away.

- The painting is approximately 2 x 3 meters in size.






La Parade de Cirque, 1887 - 1888
