

Juan Gris is a well-known Cubist artist. Cubist artists don't copy the texture, colour and shape of objects in their paintings. They create a new reality using simple shapes and colours. Before 1915, Gris uses dark colours in his paintings, but after 1915 he experiments with bright colours. Gris paints objects and people, and you often see musical instruments in his paintings. Cubist artists like to paint musical instruments because their shape is always the same.

Gris' paintings have always got interesting lines, like this painting. The lines are dramatic because they help to show different angles.

Playing kin-ball

Kin-ball is a team sport in which participants play with an enormous ball. A Physical Education teacher invented it twenty nine years ago in Canada.

The aim of the game is very simple: to catch and control the big ball before it touches the floor.

Twelve players and a referee participate in a kin-ball game. The players form three teams of four members and each team has a different colour.

When the game starts, one of the teams is in possession of the ball and must say the colour of another team and throw the ball into the air. The team wearing that colour must catch the ball. The game continues until a player makes a mistake, for example, letting the ball touch the ground.

Time periods in a kin-ball game last seven minutes and the game finishes when a team gets thirteen points.




