The Rocket Booklet: good 2nds to 4ths

Warmer: Practise using “No, it isn’t” with silly suggestions. Is it cold today? Is it Saturday?

Pre-teach the concept of riddle. Start with this: What’s this? **It has got four legs** (elicit possible answers)…, **but it isn’t an animal**. Get the SS guessing. It can be a table or chair or even a bookshelf.

This is a **riddle**. In Spanish, adivinanza

Making the booklet

Show an example of the two pieces of paper before folding: one sheet and four quarters. Ask how many pieces of paper they will need: two. One is folded into quarters and then torn (not cut, so show them how to do it) into four even pieces.

Then fold the big “mother” book so that it stands up, along with her four baby books.

Glue one baby book onto each page of the mother book, at the bottom, in the middle. Make sure the mother book opens like a book.

Working through the riddle

Draw a person with a big nose inside the first little book; a bird in the second and a fish in the third. Leave the last little booklet blank.

Start with the first page. Point to the titles of other books and say you need a title at the top. What’s a good title for this book? Riddles!

All riddles have clues (pistas). Let’s see. What’s our mystery object? It has got a big nose. (Elicit possible solutions). Is it ...a person? No, it isn’t. Tell them to cross out the picture of the person. It has got wings? Is it a bird? No, it isn’t. Cross out the picture.

Draw feet with rubber fins and say that we wear fins when we go swimming. It has got fins. Is it a fish? No, it isn’t. Cross out the picture.

Revise all the clues and then finally admit it's not an animal. Then finally give in and tell them that they can draw a picture of what the secret object is in the last baby book. Draw a rectangle that is standing (vertical). Draw a circle inside the rectangle, on the top. Draw a big triangle on the top of the rectangle. Draw two long, vertical rectangles on each side of the rectangle. Draw small rectangles on the bottom. It's a...rocket!

Now write the text little by little or cut it out and paste it.
