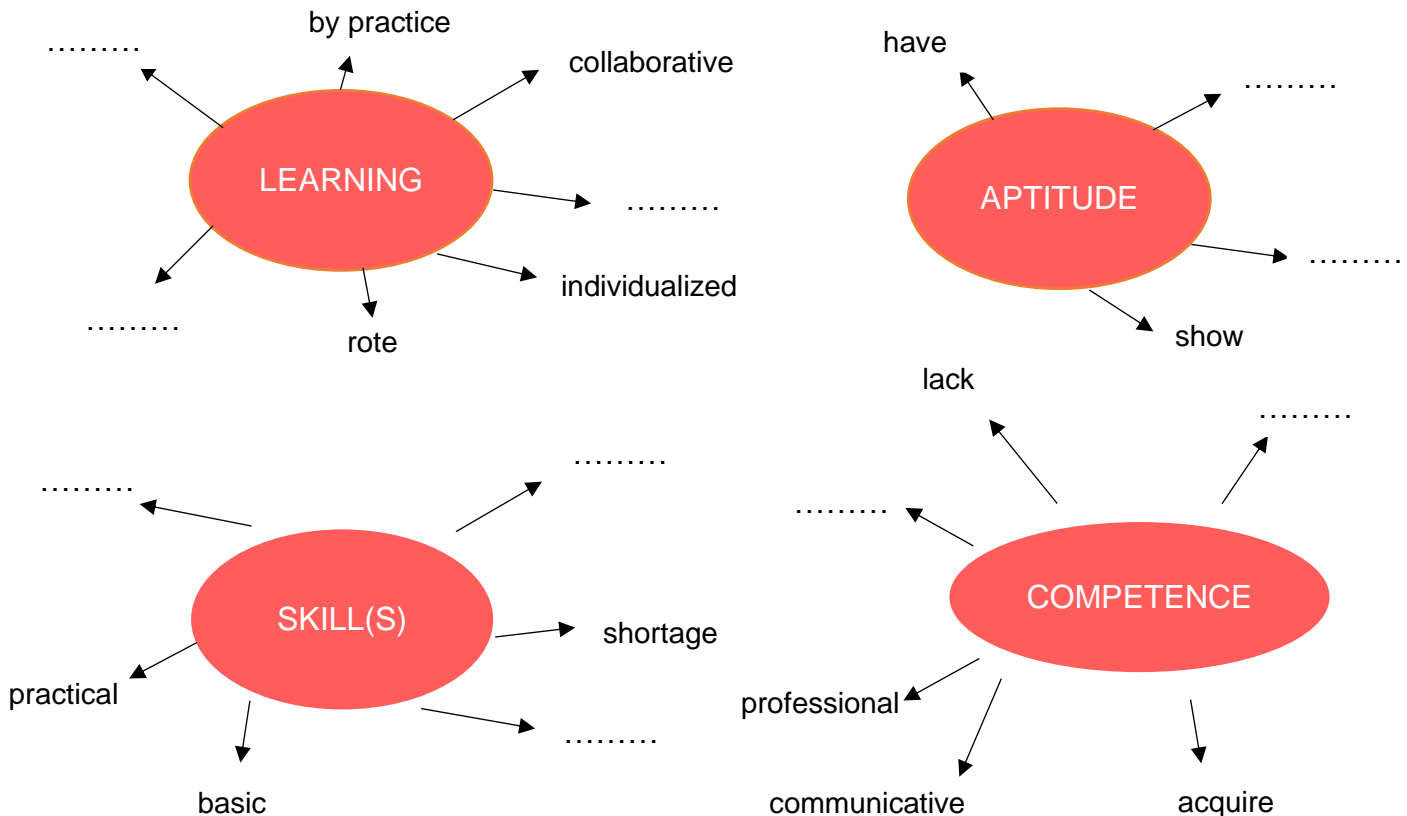


## Problems with the education system
