Re: ACTION #593. I enjoyed it. This issue didn't show Superman in every other panel as in past issues. It gave Supes a decent break and let the spotlight stay a while on Mister Miracle, which I thought was done extremely well. One thing I didn't like was seeing Mister Miracle's origin again. I felt it wasn't important to the story at hand. One thing I do like is that in recent issues you told us the creator of the guest character. Try to keep on doing that, it adds a nice touch.

Now I want to say something about all the Superman titles. How about introducing a new villain and keeping him/her around for more than two issues? I have liked all the new villains you have introduced, but you either kill them or revert them to normal.
