

Autarchy	an economic system of self-sufficiency and limited trade. A country is said to be in a complete state of autarky if it has a closed economy, which means that it does not engage in international trade with any other country.
Black Market	trading in violation of publicly imposed regulations such as rationing laws, laws against certain goods, and official rates of exchange among currencies.
Crusade	military expeditions, beginning in the late 11th century, that were organized by western European Christians in response to centuries of Muslim wars of expansion. Their objectives were to check the spread of Islam, to retake control of the Holy Land in the eastern Mediterranean, to conquer pagan areas, and to recapture formerly Christian territories. Franco supporters used this term instead of Civil War
Head of the State	the highest representative of a sovereign state, who may or may not also be its head of government. The role of the head of state is primarily representative, serving to symbolize the unity and integrity of the state at home and abroad.
Opus Dei	Roman Catholic lay and clerical conservative organization
Ration Coupon	a ticket or receipt that entitles the holder to obtain a certain amount of a product.
Standard of living	refers to the level of wealth, comfort, material goods and necessities available to a certain socioeconomic class in a certain geographic area.
