## A review

### A GET IDEAS

- Think of a book, film, etc. to write about. Choose something you know well.
- Make notes about what you remember about the book, film, etc. Then choose the most essential details.
- Decide whether you generally liked or disliked it. It might help you to choose a rating: ☆☆☆☆☆
- Make notes about what you liked and didn't like, and why.

### B PLAN

Organize your ideas into paragraphs. For example:

- Paragraph 1** Introduction, including the title, author / director etc., characters and setting
- Paragraph 2** Summary of the plot
- Paragraph 3** What you liked and didn't like
- Paragraph 4** Conclusion and a recommendation to others

2. You'll have to hand me the review in, so make sure you write it down and give it to me during the exam. I won't mind whether it is handwritten or typed, but it's part of your grade.

3. You can also use the written review as a guide... but don't read it ;)

4. On that note, don't use any AI or Translator. Believe me, we know when you do.

5. Furthermore, get ready for questions about your choice as we also need to evaluate your interaction.

6. Finally, you'll be evaluated with a rubric where housework, interaction, presentation and pronunciation will be evaluated.
