Important Words to Know



Subject

The performer of the action (I, You, He, She, It, We, They).



Affirmative

A sentence stating 'Yes' or an action.



Negative

A sentence that says 'No' using the word 'not'.



Interrogative

A question ending with a question mark (?).

The Super Verb: 'To Be'

Using 'To Be' (Am/Is/Are)

Use for identity or feelings.

Affirmative:

I am happy. He/She/It is fast.

You/We/They are friends.

Negative:

I am not sad. He isn't slow.

Interrogative:

Are you ready?

The 'To Have' Verb



Having things! Use for ownership.

The Rule: Use **have**, but **He, She, It** use **has**.

Examples:

- I **have** a dog.
- She **has** a cat.
- **Does** he **have** a ball?
(Questions use **have**).

Action Verbs (Like Eat, Play, Run)

The 'S' Secret: For He, She, It, add -s to verbs.

Affirmative: I play; He plays.

Negative: I don't play; He doesn't play.

Interrogative: Do you play? Does she play?
