ZERO CONDITIONAL

Examples Sentences

If-Clause (Condition)	Main Clause (Result)
If you heat water to 100°C,	it boils.
If you touch fire,	you get burned.
If you freeze water,	it becomes ice.
If the alarm goes off,	we wake up.
If you press this button,	the machine stops.
If you add sugar to tea,	it tastes sweet.
If you sleep late,	you feel tired.
If you exercise regularly,	you stay fit.
If the clock strikes twelve,	it is noon.
If you mix yellow and blue,	you get green.
If you don't study,	you don't learn.

1. **If** you do not win scholarship, your father **will** be very sad.
2. **If** I study hard, I **will** pass the exam.
3. **If** I have enough strawberries, I **will** bake a strawberry cake for you.
4. **If** it doesn't rain tomorrow, We **will** go on a picnic.
5. **If** she doesn't hurry, she **will** be late.

THIRD CONDITIONALS - FORM

1st part: IF sentence

= describes the condition

IF + PAST PERFECT (had+pp)

2nd part:

the result

WOULD HAVE + PP

- It doesn't matter which order we put these two parts of the sentence.
- BUT... IF + pp / WOULD HAVE + PP
- SPOKEN ENGLISH. Contractions I'd / would've (woulda)

THIRD CONDITIONALS - USE

WHEN WE TALK ABOUT THE PAST AND TALK ABOUT A VERSION THAT DIDN'T HAPPEN...

- **If I had eaten that...** (I didn't eat it, but if hypothetically looking at a version in the past that didn't happen, in which I ate it..)
- (and then we imagine the result of that situation in the past) **... I would have been sick.**

So we are describing an event that didn't happen in the past and we are imagining the result of that invented situation.

We did it all the time in our native language, for instance, when we talk about a regret... If we'd scored that goal, we would have won the game.

CHAIN STORY

Think about a past moment in your life and start joining imaginary events.

If i hadn't met my friend, I wouldn't have ...

CONDITIONALS

Zero Conditional: the result always happens (scientific facts)

1st Conditional: the result will probably happen

2nd Conditional: the result is almost impossible. Or when it's not true (If I were you...)

3rd Conditional: past events that didn't happen, so we imagine the result.
