and modal perfects

What's a modal verb?

- They help express a speaker's attitude or opinion, obligation, permission, possibility,...
- They function as an auxiliary
- They don't use -s for the third person sg

ABILITY AND PERMISSION

- PRESENT TENSE:
 - Ability: CAN
 - Permission: CAN / MAY
 - PAST TENSE:
 - Ability: COULD
 - OTHER TENSES:
 - Ability: BE ABLE TO
 - Permission: ALLOW TO

ABILITY AND PERMISSION

- **PRESENT TENSE:**

- Ability: CAN
- Permission: CAN / COULD / MAY

- **PAST TENSE:**

- Ability: COULD

- **OTHER TENSES:**

- Ability: BE ABLE TO
- Permission: ALLOW TO

ABILITY AND PERMISSION

She can speak six languages (ability)

My grandfather could play golf (ability)

He won't be able to speak Japanese in a week! (ability)

Can we swim in the lake? (permission)

Could I leave early today, please? (permission)

You may not use the car tonight (permission)

ADVICE

- Should
- Ought to (more formal; not common in questions)

ADVICE

- You should stop smoking
- She shouldn't speak to her father like that
- You ought to be kinder to him
- He ought to be home by 7 o'clock


OBLIGATION

- MORAL OBLIGATION:
 - **have to** (neg. don't have to)
- STRONG OBLIGATION / NECESSITY:
 - **must**

*CAREFUL! **Mustn't** is for **prohibition**.

Don't have to means **you don't need to do** something.

OBLIGATION

- Children have to go to school.
 - I don't have to get up early at the weekend.
 - You must wear a uniform
 - You mustn't smoke here
- 

NECESSITY & NO OBLIGATION

- NECESSITY:
 - **need to / need**
- NO OBLIGATION:
 - **needn't / don't need to**

NECESSITY & NO OBLIGATION

- Does it need to be so dar in here?
- Need it be so dark in here? (formal)
- You don't need to mention this to your father.
- You needn't mention this to your father.

POSSIBILITY & CERTAINTY

- **POSSIBILITY:**
 - **may / may not / might / might not / could**
- **DEDUCTION OF SOMETHING TRUE:**
 - **must**
- **DEDUCTION OF SOMETHING IMPOSSIBLE:**
 - **can't**

POSSIBILITY & CERTAINTY

- She might come soon
- She may be in the wrong room
- She must be on the bus (I'm sure it's a good guess)
- She can't be at home (I'm sure this isn't true)
