## **CLAUSES OF REASON**

**CLAUSES OF REASON** express the cause or **the reason why** something is happening and are introduced by various words or phrases.

because + clause	The bus arrived late <b>because</b> the traffic was heavy.
because of + noun / pronoun	The bus arrived late <b>because of</b> the heavy traffic.
as / since + clause	The bus arrived late <b>as</b> / <b>since</b> the traffic was heavy.
	Since / as the traffic was heavy, the bus arrived late.
due to / on account of + noun	The bus arrived late <b>due to</b> the heavy traffic.
	The bus arrived late <b>on account of</b> the heavy traffic.
due to / on account of the fact that +	The bus arrived late <b>due to the fact that</b> the traffic was heavy.
clause	The bus arrived late <b>on account of the fact that</b> the traffic was heavy.

<sup>\*</sup> We normally use "because" to give the reason and the "because clause" usually comes at the end.

<sup>\*</sup> In writing the reason clause is sometimes put first. In this case we prefer to use "as" or "since" instead of "because".

<sup>&</sup>quot;Many people from Europe and South America go to the USA **because** they need to do business there. And, **since** they have to speak to Americans, they have to learn English."

## **CLAUSES OF RESULT**

The clauses of result express **the consequence or result** of something happening (the reason). They are introduced by one of these connectors:

<b>so, therefore</b> (a bit more formal) <b>, consequently</b> + clause	All the lights in our house are led, <b>so / therefore</b> <i>consequently</i> we save a lot on our electricity bill.
* as a consequence, for this reason, this/that is the reason why and as a result + clause	All the lights in our house are led. <b>As a consequence/ For this/that reason/ That is the reason why/ As a result,</b> we save a lot on our electricity bill.
As a result of + noun	As a result of our led lights, we save a lot on our electricity bill.  OR  We save a lot on our electricity bill as a result of our led lights.

<sup>\*</sup> It is very important to pay attention to punctuation; as a consequence, for this reason, this/that is the reason why and as a result are always preceded by strong punctuation marks (; or .) and followed by a comma.
