

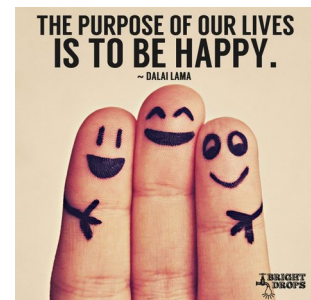
CLAUSES OF PURPOSE

[WHAT FOR?]

(NOT) TO + INFINITIVE	AFFIRMATIVE / NEGATIVE (same subject)	I'm saving money to buy a new car.
IN ORDER (NOT) TO + INFINITIVE SO AS (NOT) TO + INFINITIVE	AFFIRMATIVE / NEGATIVE (same subject)	I'm saving money in order to /so as to buy a car. I'm studying hard in order not to / so as not to fail.
SO THAT + CLAUSE IN ORDER THAT + CLAUSE Reminder! Main Verb Present → Clause verb WILL/CAN Main Verb Past → Clause verb WOULD/COULD	Usually followed by a modal verb (same/different subjects)	I'm saving money so that you can/will buy a car. I'm saving money in order that you can/will buy... I saved money so that you could/would buy a car.
