
CLAUSES OF PURPOSE

[WHAT FOR?]

(NOT) TO + INFINITIVE	AFFIRMATIVE / NEGATIVE (same subject)	I'm saving money to buy a new car.
IN ORDER (NOT)TO + INFINITIVE	AFFIRMATIVE / NEGATIVE	I'm saving money in order to /so as to buy a car.
SO AS (NOT) TO + INFINITIVE	(same subject)	I'm studying hard in order not to / so as not to fail.
SO THAT + CLAUSE		
IN ORDER THAT + CLAUSE	Usually followed by	I'm saving money so that you can/will buy a car.
Reminder!	a modal verb	I'm saving money in order that you can/will buy
Main Verb Present Clause verb WILL/CAN	(same/different subjects)	I saved money so that you could/would buy a car.
