<b>WILL (WON'T) + Infinitive</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Absolute certainty / Stating a fact</li> <li>● Predictions based on opinion</li> <li>● After expressions: I think / believe reckon / bet / guess / suppose / hope I'm sure / certain....</li> <li>● Decisions at the moment (instantaneous)</li> <li>● Promises/ Offers</li> <li>● Time clauses (when, as soon as)</li> <li>● Conditional sentences Type 1</li> </ul>	<p><i>2020 <b>will be</b> a leap year.</i></p> <p><i>1. Tomorrow it <b>will rain</b>.</i></p> <p><i>2. One day, Lady Gaga <b>will win</b> an Oscar.</i></p> <p><i>I think/hope that in ten years' time everybody <b>will travel</b> by eco-friendly cars.</i></p> <p><i>Those jeans are really cheap. I'll <b>buy</b> two pairs.</i></p> <p><i>Sorry, mum. I <b>won't be</b> late again.</i></p> <p><i>When / As soon as I get home today, I'll <b>take</b> a nap.</i></p> <p><i>If you help me with my homework, I'll <b>buy</b> you a pizza.</i></p>
<b>BE GOING TO + Infinitive</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Predictions based on previous evidence</li> <li>● Future plans or intentions (no arrangements of details made). Premeditated decisions.</li> </ul>	<p><i>The temperature is below zero. It's <b>going to snow</b>.</i></p> <p><i>I'm <b>going to join</b> a gym and get fit.</i></p>
<b>PRESENT CONTINUOUS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Future scheduled arrangements (including specific time expressions and usually with verbs of movement)</li> </ul>	<p><i>I'm <b>leaving</b> for Madrid on Saturday, on the 7 o'clock flight.</i></p>
<b>PRESENT SIMPLE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Timetables: transportation timetables, concerts, classes, banks and shops openings and closings...</li> </ul>	<p><i>The train bound for Santiago <b>leaves</b> at 9:40 and <b>arrives</b> at 10:00.</i></p>

COMPOUND FUTURE TENSES	USES	EXAMPLES
<b>FUTURE CONTINUOUS</b>  WILL BE + -ING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To talk about something that will be in progress at or around a time in the future. It is a type of prediction.</li> </ul>	<p><i>Don't call me at 9, I'll <b>be having</b> dinner.</i></p> <p><i>Next year in May, we'll <b>be studying</b> for the university entrance exam.</i></p>
<b>FUTURE PERFECT</b>  WILL HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To say that something will be finished by a particular time in the future.</li> </ul> <p>Time expressions with 'by' or 'in'</p>	<p><i>I think astronauts <b>will have landed</b> on Mars by the year 2020. (by = no later than)</i></p> <p><i>I'll <b>have finished</b> in an hour and then you can use the computer (in = within a period of time)</i></p>
