THEORY ABOUT THE AUXULIARY VERBS "CAN" & "COULD":

Modal Verbs: Can and Could

The Use

These auxiliary verbs are employed to refer to: Present or Past Ability and Permission

- Can is used to refer to:
- 1. An ability that we have now, at present. (Present Ability)

Example: I can play football very well.

2.. Present Permission (The action that you use to ask for consent to do something.)

Example: Can I open the window?

- Could is used to refer to:
- 1. An ability that we had in the past. (Past Ability)

Example: I could run very fast when I was five years old.

2.. Past Permission (The action that you used to ask for permission or express it in the past.)

Example: Could you draw an apple tree when you were four years old?

The Forms

The Forms of Can and Could are the same for all the persons:

1. CAN (En el presente)

I can play football You can play He/ She / It can play We can play You can plsy They can play	I can't play football You can't play He/ She / It can't play We can't play You can't plsy They can't play	Can I play football? 2. COULD (En el pasado)

AFFIRMATIVE FORMS	NEGATIVE FORMAS	INTERROGATIVE FORMS
I could play football You could play He/ She / It could play We could play You could plsy They could play	I couldn't play football You couldn't play He/ She / It couldn't play We couldn't play You couldn't plsy They couldn't play	Could I play football? Could you play? Could he / she / it play? Could we play? Could you play? Could they play?
Yo (Ellos)podía / sabía jugar al fútbol.	Yo (Ellos)no podía / sabía jugar al fútbol.	Podía yo (Ellos) jugar al fútbol?
