THEORY: CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

There are four types of Conditional Sentences in English.

- 1. The Zero Conditional
- 2. The First Conditional
- 3. The Second Conditional
- 4. The Third Conditional

- The Zero Conditional:

It serves to describe eternal truths. (if + present simple, ... present simple) If you heat water to 100 degrees, it boils.

-The First Conditional:

It serves to talk about a possible result in the future (if + present simple, ... will + infinitive)

If it rains tomorrow, we'll go to the cinema.

-The Second Conditional:

It serves to talk about an improbable result at present (if + past simple, ... would + infinitive)

If I had a lot of money, I would travel around the world.

-The Third Conditional

It seerves to talk about an impossile result in the past (if + past perfect, ... would + have + past participle)

If I had gone to bed early, I would have caught the train.
