In the present simple third person singular (he, she, it) we add **s / es / ies** to the verb:

es

We add **es** to verbs ending with **ch, sh, ss, x, o**

teach → teaches
wash → washes
kiss → kisses
fix → fixes
go → goes

ies

When the verb ends with consonant+y, we drop the y and add **ies**

fly → flies
try → tries
cry → cries
study → studies
carry → carries

s

We add **s** to all the other verbs

walk → walks
love → loves
swim → swims
play → plays
sit → sits
