Offering to help / spontaneous decision → "will"

There's visible evidence → "be going to"

7. They **are having** dinner with us tonight — we booked the table yesterday.

Fixed plan → Present Continuous

8. I promise I won't be late again.

Promise → "will" (negative form)

 Continuous for ongoing activity / Simple for result or achievement
- 4. It has been raining all morning, but it finally has stopped now.

 Continuous for activity duration / Simple for recent completion
- 5. I haven't seen Emma recently. She has been working long hours at the hospital.
 - Simple for something not done recently / Continuous for ongoing action
