

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

We use the Present Continuous Tense when talking about things that are happening right now or around the current time.

-ing spelling rules

READ THE RULES AND COLOUR THE HEARTS. WRITE THE -ING ENDING TO THE VERBS. OMIT ANY NECESSARY LETTERS.

- ♥ RED: add -ing to the ending of most verbs
- ♥ BLUE: drop the "e" and add -ing to verbs ending in "e"
- ♥ GREEN: double the last consonant and add -ing to one-syllable verbs ending in consonant+vowel+consonant
