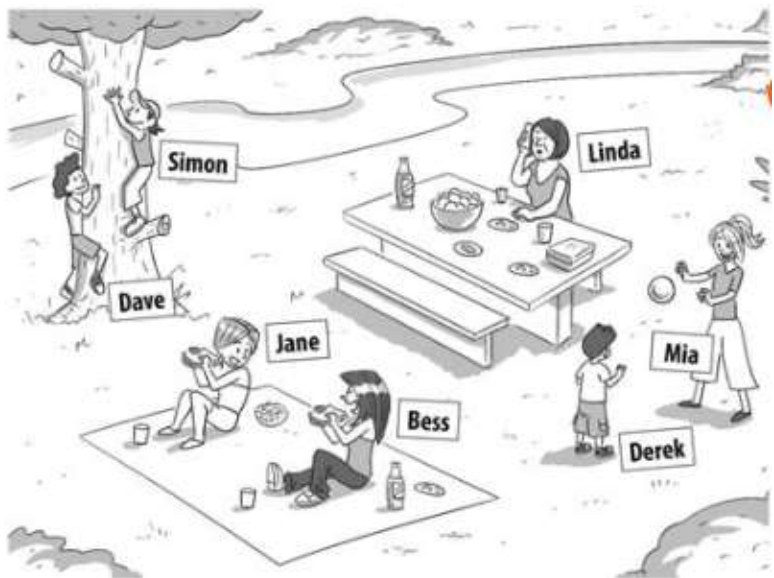

## ONE DRESS - 100 DAYS

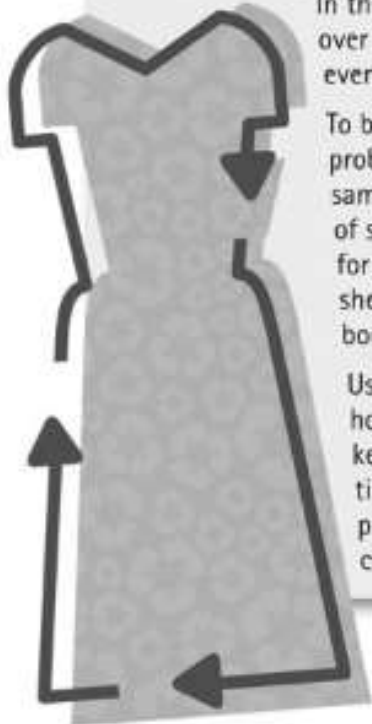
Art teacher Julia Mooney thinks people buy too many clothes and this damages the environment. Fashion is changing all the time and people want to look trendy, so many people only wear their new clothes two or three times. Then, they leave them at the back of their cupboard, or throw them out and buy new clothes. Mooney wants her students to think about the effect of this "fast fashion" on the environment. What is she planning to do? She's going to wear the same clothes for 100 days!

Factories make about 80 billion items of clothing a year. They use 2,720 litres of water to make one T-shirt. In the process, they also pollute our rivers and oceans. They create a huge amount of rubbish.

In the USA alone, people throw out over 9.5 billion kilograms of textiles every year.

To bring attention to these problems, Mooney is wearing the same clothes for the first 100 days of school. She chose a grey dress for her experiment. On cold days, she is going to add leggings and boots.

Using this experiment, Mooney hopes to teach her students to keep their clothes for a longer time, reduce waste and help to preserve the environment. They can also save some money.
